Generic JOL Mailboxes

Each Local Resilience Forum (LRF), Police, Fire & Rescue Service and Ambulance Service has a generic JOL Mailbox. The Single Points of Contacts (SPoC) for each service have the responsibility for monitoring this mailbox and forwarding all the relevant information to colleagues in their organisation.

If you have identified a lesson you would like to share but you are not a JOL Online User, you can do so by sending it to your organisation's JOL mailbox where the SPoC will pick it up. If you don't know your JOL mailbox address, please contact the address will be sent to you.

JOL Online Updates

The embedding workshops assisted greatly in providing feedback and we are currently working on implementing the ideas discussed, some of which have already been implemented. These include:

- A new submissions tab where you can find all your submissions and review their status
- Clarity around the JOL SPoC tick box when creating an account - to make users aware of the process for becoming a JOL SPoC
- **Published submissions** have been re-organised so when viewing a submission you see the summary first
- The location questions are now optional to provide assurance of anonymity
- The footer bar has now been reduced to **improve** visibility on smaller screens
- You can now download reports regarding JOL Activity in graph format and print to PDF.

JOL ONLINE ACTIVITY

This section of the newsletter highlights some of the lessons identified and notable practice that you have uploaded onto JOL Online.

LESSON IDENTIFIED TREND

A number of submissions have been received regarding initial information not being shared amongst responding agencies. The use of METHANE when communicating between control rooms encourages a robust process to ensure all relevant information is shared.

NOTABLE PRACTICE NP01331, NP01343, NP01344

A Police Service has kindly shared their documentation with all JOL Online SPoCs to assist other agencies to provide assurance with regards to embedding JESIP. There is also an Organisational Learning document which documents their procedures for learning within their organisation.

LESSON IDENTIFIED LI01365

A recent incident resulted in a near miss when working around rail. It is vital you ensure all first responders are safe and communicated with before the railway line is re-opened. We will keep you updated with the progress of this lesson.

LESSON IDENTIFIED LI01352

At a recent incident it was identified that carbon monoxide from the exhaust of an outside generator had entered through the cavity of a nearby domestic address. This should be considered when completing risk assessments regarding the placement of portable generators.

NOTABLE PRACTICE NP01347

An LRF has created information folders for their SCG commanders. These folders include:

- JESIP material
- a list of powers and policies
- The LRF Emergency Procedures Manual
- SCG and TCG Aide Memoire
- **Strategic Policy**
- Standardised agreed agendas
- common objectives

These folders provide a better understanding of LRF procedures, documentation and JESIP principles.

The same will be produced for TCG, Cell Chairs & Command Support Managers.
