Seven Assurance Visit Recommendations



The JESIP team visited 101 emergency services throughout 2017 to assess the national picture with embedding the JESIP ways of working into business as usual activity. The results of the visits were reported back to the Interoperability Board and Government Departments and the findings highlighted seven key points that were recommended to services to assist with effective embedding.

The recommendations are:

- Services should prioritise a review of local policies, plans and procedures based on risk.
 This review should ensure JESIP models and principles are included in all relevant documents and materials.
- 2. Single sector models should be eradicated from local policies, plans and procedures which duplicate JESIP.
- 3. Commanders, control room managers and supervisors should attend a multi-agency training course every three years. All frontline responders and control room staff to receive JESIP awareness annually
- 4. A robust training calendar should be in place for multi-agency and refresher courses and awareness products should be provided to frontline and control room staff.
- 5. Exercises should be in place which include the <u>JESIP exercise objectives</u>. All commanders should be **recorded** as attending an exercise incorporating <u>JESIP every</u> **3 years** and the <u>JESIP Exercise Assurance Framework</u> should be considered by services as a partnership model for delivery.
- 6. Lessons identification and sharing arrangements should be formalised. Local policies should support the identification of lessons through a multi-agency debrief process and then shared via <u>JOL Online</u>. This must include who will be responsible for uploading these and when.
- 7. Services should adhere to and note existing Notable Practice that is placed on JOL Online.
